

Detailed Program Schedule:

An Educational visit to Sultanpur Wetland under Sultanpur National Park, Gurugram, Haryana was organized on 2nd Feb, 2023 by Kadam Association, Department of Environmental Science, Faculty of Science, on the occassion of WORLD WETLANDS DAY, 2023. Around 40 students along with four faculty members visited the wetland with the aim to raise awareness among students about the vital role of wetlands for people and planet as well as need of wetlands' conservation. Short video making competition at the wetland was another main objective of the visit. Students were sensitized about the present status of the wetlands across the Globe, their environmental services, conservation methods and status of the wetlands in India. Students were also informed about the adverse impacts of human activities on the wetlands. After the knowledge sharing session, students were set free for bird watching, photography and videography. It was a fruitful visit for the students to raise awareness about wetlands and to understand the role of public participation in wetlands' conservation.
